Classroom-tested methods for meeting the history-social science content standards while building literacy skills:

- ❖ Teaching history to develop literacy
- ❖ Planning lessons and units around a question or thesis
- ❖ Using primary and secondary sources, including your textbook, effectively
- ❖ Developing active readers
- ❖ Focusing on the language of history to teach both language and history
- ❖ Building expository writing skills
- ❖ Teaching paragraph and essay development to include thesis, evidence, and analysis
- ❖ Developing academic language skills for English learners and struggling students

We will demonstrate reading, thinking, writing, and academic language development strategies embedded in standards-based lessons. You will collaborate with Bay Area teachers in creating a literacy- and history-focused lesson.

with two Saturday follow-up sessions on November 5, 2005 and April 29, 2006

**Where:** UC Berkeley campus

**Fee:** \$400.00 (Many schools and districts have paid for teachers to attend this institute.)

**Credits:** Optional UC Berkeley Extension credits available for an additional fee. (Credits will be conferred in May 2006 and are contingent on summer institute and follow-up attendance as well as on submitting an integrated literacy and history lesson with student work).
